The Library Curriculum

The GA library curriculum is based upon the guidelines laid out in State of Michigan Library Media Programs, as well as AASL's Standards for the 21st Century Learner. We will be discussing various information literacy concepts throughout the year, including, but not limited to:

- Resources in the Library
- Organization of the Library; Dewey Decimal System
- Parts of a Book
- Fiction vs. Informational/Non-fiction
- Text Features of Informational Books
- Fiction Genres
- Research Skills (reference books in the library, website evaluation, search strategies, bibliographies)
- Using the OPAC and Online Catalog

Pre-K through 5th grade students will visit the library once a week for read-alouds, information literacy lessons/activities, and book checkout. They may also use their library time to complete AR tests. Academy students will visit the library with their teachers as research needs arise. They are welcome to check out books any time I am at the desk or when they visit the library with their ELA teacher.

Students do not receive a grade for Library, though they can, as a class and individually, earn rewards for good behavior.

The Computer Curriculum

The GA computer curriculum is based upon the guidelines laid out in the State of Michigan Technology Programs, as well as ISTE and AASL's Standards for the 21st Century Learner. - II. Digital Citizenship & Online Safety
- III. Research Skills & Web Evaluation
- IV. Productivity and Collaboration
 - Collaboration using Google for Education apps
 - Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Publisher
 - iPad apps
 - Other Web 2.0 Apps & Tools
 - Creating and sharing screencasts, videos, book trailers, virtual flyers, presentations, etc.
 - Creating websites/digital portfolios
- V. Computer Programming/Coding

Grading Procedures

Students are graded as follows:

- Kindergarten: Effort/Participation 100%
- 1st - 2nd: Classwork 50%, Conduct/Effort 50%
- 3rd - 5th: Classwork/Projects 60%, Conduct/Effort 40%
- Academy: Classwork/Projects/Homework 70%, Conduct/Effort 30%

Note that most projects this year are designed to be completed at school. Students are, therefore, advised to use their class time well. Any work that is due at the end of the class that is not completed satisfactorily becomes homework and is due at the beginning of the next class. In cases where students do not have computer or internet access at home for homework, alternative arrangements can be made ahead of time.
